The City of Yellowknife encourages residents to sign up for its new emergency email notification system, which allows residents to sign up to receive immediate updates to their inboxes during an emergency situation. This system will send residents an email with emergency updates when they occur, and will provide information on where people can go to get more details.

Residents are encouraged to join to stay up-to-date on City of Yellowknife critical public safety updates.

PLEASE NOTE: This is NOT the same as the Emergency Alert Notification System the Government of the Northwest Territories operates which sends a notification right to your cellular device, nor is it meant to replace these notifications. Tipping Fee for Mattresses

Effective June 1, 2024 the Solid Waste Facility will be introducing a tipping fee for mattresses. Residents and businesses disposing of mattresses will now be required to pay \$25 per mattress to cover the cost involved in managing this type of bulky waste. Grass Clippings and Leaves

Leaves, grass clippings, and small brush can be brought to the Solid Waste Facility and disposed of free of charge when placed in a paper bag. However, when this waste comes to the SWF in plastic and other non-compostable bags, it is considered residential garbage and is subject to the associated charges. Let's work together to divert as much waste as possible from the landfill by ensuring that no plastic is mixed with leaf and yard waste. Animal Waste

The City of Yellowknife reminds residents not to place animal waste in their green cart. Animal waste should be taken to the Solid Waste Facility, free of charge, and placed in the yellow Animal Waste bin for safe disposal. The SWF is open to the public from 11:00 a.m. to 5:15 p.m., Tuesday to Sunday, closed to the public on Mondays.
