

# **REACHING HOME FUNDING AVAILABLE**

Near the end of 2023, the City of Yellowknife secured a four-year extension on their federal Reaching Home funding agreement. From April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2028, the City will continue to receive funds annually to address homelessness and housing needs in Yellowknife.

As we head into our second year of the four-year extension, the City is seeking project proposals from NGOs and charitable organizations geared towards supporting our local unhoused community. For the upcoming fiscal year from April 1, 2025 to March 31, 2026, \$535,000 of Reaching Home funding will be available to support these projects.

To apply for this funding, NGOs and charitable organizations are invited to send their project proposals to the City's Homelessness Division at <u>homelessness@yellowknife.ca</u> by January **31**, **2025** at **12:00** p.m. (noon). Submissions must focus on impactful, start ready initiatives, and align with the Government of Canada's <u>Reaching Home directives</u>.

Proposals will be reviewed, and funding decisions made by the Community Advisory Board on Homelessness in March 2025. Once the funding allocations have been determined, successful applicants will be contacted directly. ### DOG IMPOUND FEE INCREASED

The City of Yellowknife would like to remind the public of the increase in the dog impoundment fee, which took effect on January 1, 2025. This fee increase was approved by City Council in December 2024. The dog impoundment fee applies to dog owners whose pet is being held due to being separated from their owner.

This fee adjustment supports the increasing costs of daily care when dogs are impounded. Dog owners are encouraged to ensure their pets are properly licensed, controlled, and supervised at all times to avoid impoundment and associated fees.

The City is committed to ensuring the safety of our community and promoting responsible dog ownership. Municipal Enforcement Officers are trained and equipped to deal with any sort of complaint or call involving dogs to ensure compliance with City by-laws. # 2024 ASSESSMENTS FOR 2025 TAXATION

Property Assessment Notices have been mailed to all ratepayers (persons or businesses responsible for paying property taxes). An assessment is a value placed on property (land and buildings) for municipal and school tax purposes.

Assessment Open Houses are scheduled for January 23 and 24, 2025 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at City Hall. The Assessor will be on site to answer assessment questions by appointment. Residents may call (867) 920-5664 or (867) 920-5625 to make an appointment with the Assessor or to speak to a representative regarding assessments.

For information regarding school support declarations and assessment appeals, please consult <u>A Guide to Property Taxes</u>. Appeals may only be filed against the assessment values of your property, not the amount of taxes collected. Note that the deadline to file a school support declarations, or to make an appeal, is **February 20, 2025**.

Property owners can compare assessment with other similar properties in their neighbourhood using the City's online tool, CityExplorer. For land comparisons, ensure similarity of location, lot size and zoning. For building comparisons, ensure similarity of age, quality, style and size.

### DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVES

The City of Yellowknife is pleased to introduce new development incentives (tax abatements and grants) to support housing, land and revitalization initiatives. These incentives are available to the successful individuals, businesses and organizations who complete an application.

Tax abatement and grant applications are now open, and will be accepted on an ongoing basis. Applicants are encouraged to apply as soon as possible, as funding for this multi-year program is limited and will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Applicants can apply for only one abatement per development and multiple grants per development. Note that several grants in combination with one abatement can be used for the same development.

In addition to offering grants and tax abatements to eligible applicants, City in-kind initiatives will be introduced as part of these new incentives.

Look Up! How does your chimney look? Is there a build-up of ice?

Remove the ice build-up on your chimney to ensure it doesn't collapse the chimney liner. With temperatures of -30C and colder, ice builds up quickly. If your chimney liner is damaged, carbon monoxide will invade your home.

- Remove the ice before it builds up on your chimney;
- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) detector close to your bedrooms; • and
- When you have your furnace or boiler serviced, have them check your chimney liner to ensure there is no damage.
